

ORDINANCE NO. 2006-68

AN ORDINANCE OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA, A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE STATE OF FLORIDA; AMENDING CERTAIN PARKING PROVISIONS OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY ORDINANCE 2003-05 (PONTE VEDRA ZONING DISTRICT REGULATIONS); REGULATING THE PARKING OF VEHICLES ON PONTE VEDRA BLVD; PROVIDING SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Ponte Vedra Boulevard in the northeastern portion of St. Johns County is unique among St. Johns County roadways in terms of its aesthetic qualities and historical significance; and

WHEREAS, Ponte Vedra Boulevard, due to the nature of its landscaping and development patterns, presents a parking challenge that impacts public health, safety, and welfare unless properly regulated; and

WHEREAS, traffic enforcement and parking expertise from the St. Johns County Sheriff's Office and the St. Johns County Road and Bridge Department has been utilized in the formation of appropriate parking regulations pertaining to Ponte Vedra Boulevard; and

WHEREAS, such parking regulations are not land development regulations, but are placed in the Ponte Vedra Zoning Regulations for administrative convenience.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of County Commissioners of St. Johns County, Florida as follows:

Section 1. Section **IX.D.11** of Ordinance 2003-05 is hereby repealed and replaced with the following:

11. No parking is allowed in the right-of-way of Ponte Vedra Boulevard (County Road 203) between Duval County Line and the point of curvature depicted in Exhibit "A" (attached hereto and incorporated herein), with the following exceptions:
 - a. Emergency and law enforcement vehicles;
 - b. Public service related vehicles, including but not limited to waste/recycling collection, U.S. Postal mail delivery, and utility vehicles;
 - c. "Oversized Vehicles" which shall include the following as defined or described by Chapters 316 and 320, Florida Statutes:
 - (i) Bus; School Bus

- (ii) Trailer
- (iii) Special Mobile Equipment
- (iv) Pole Trailer
- (v) Recreational Vehicle
- (vi) Truck Tractor
- (vii) Truck-Tractor-Semi trailer
- (viii) Any other vehicle with 3 or more axles, including any connections to the rear of the vehicle.

Parking of an oversized vehicle for greater than 10 minutes shall require the use of onsite flag persons or safety cones.

- d. Resident or non-resident owned vehicles parked under the supervision of on-scene traffic control deputies provided by the St. Johns County Sheriff's Office at the resident's or non-resident's expense. One traffic control deputy shall be required for ten (10) or fewer vehicles; two traffic control deputies shall be required for greater than ten (10) vehicles, up to a maximum of twenty-five (25) vehicles. Persons wishing to exercise this exception must complete the following:
- (i) Obtain a permit at least two (2) weeks in advance of the date that the parking event is desired. The two week requirement may be waived for unavoidable exigent circumstances; e.g. funerals, etc. The Sheriff may reasonably determine on a case-by-case basis what constitutes an unavoidable exigent circumstance.
 - (ii) Permits will be issued by the Patrol Administrator of the St. Johns County Sheriff's Office at no cost.
 - (iii) Permits will not be issued for parking between the hours of 1:00am and 7:00am.
 - (iv) Permits will only be issued for one day at a time and the permit holder will be responsible for contracting for law enforcement traffic control services for the duration of the permitted parking event.
 - (v) Permit holder must be present or available by telephone during the parking event.

e. Pre-existing improved public parking adjacent to Carlyle Condominiums.

Parking shall not be allowed on sidewalks or within five (5) feet of an existing driveway.

Violations of this Subsection IX.D.11 (11.a-e.above) shall be deemed violations of the St. Johns County Parking Ordinance (Ordinance 2006-58), as may be amended from time to time.

Parking/Placement of construction materials, dumpsters, construction debris containers, portable toilets, or any other construction-related item is prohibited in the right-of-way of Ponte Vedra Boulevard (County Road 203), as described in this subsection.

SECTION 2. Severability. If any phrase, sentence, paragraph, or section of this Ordinance is declared unconstitutional or otherwise illegal, or if its applicability to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the validity of the remainder of this Ordinance and the applicability of it to other persons and circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

SECTION 3. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective July 30, 2006.
