# PONTE VEDRA

THIS PIECE WAS CREATED AND DISTRIBUTED BY  
YOUR PONTE VEDRA COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION.

Our streets are more and more congested with landscapers, contractors, delivery vehicles and visitors. And they are significantly more dangerous for children, walkers, runners—frankly, everyone. Fortunately, we have not had any injuries this year.

The PVCA continues to work with MSD and St. Johns County to consider more sidewalks to provide for greater safety. The current focus is completion of the sidewalk at the north end of Ponte Vedra Boulevard. There are also efforts to evaluate safety measures and sidewalks on San Juan Drive and other streets in the near future.

Prior to any sidewalks being built, we need help from everyone in the community.



WALKERS & RUNNERS go AGAINST traffic by FLORIDA LAW.

- Wear reflective clothing at night and/or a light for greater visibility.
- Pedestrians always have right of way over all vehicles.
- Whenever possible, walk on the sidewalk.



BE CAREFUL maneuvering around parked vehicles. *Families with strollers, walkers with dogs and children are hard to see.*

- OBSERVE THE SPEED LIMIT.
- Obey the traffic laws, including all stop signs.
- Drivers are required to keep 3ft or more from cyclists.



REDUCE CONGESTION; get parked vehicles off our streets.

- Ask your construction workers, landscapers and contractors to park in your driveway or right of way.
- Move parked vehicles off the road and make our streets safer for everyone.



BICYCLES are vehicles and must follow all traffic laws by FLORIDA LAW.

- Come to a full stop at stop signs and look both ways.
- Cyclists should RIDE WITH traffic.
- Riding single file is safest.
- Cyclists riding on a sidewalk should yield the right of way to pedestrians.



GOLF CARTS are vehicles; they have the capacity to drive over neighborhood speed limits, which are set by FLORIDA LAW.

- Golf carts must follow ALL TRAFFIC LAWS like STOPPING and SIGNALING at stop signs.
- It is illegal and unsafe to allow underage, unlicensed drivers drive your golf cart.
- FLORIDA LAW requires that all golf carts be licensed and insured.
